**Neonicitinoid Use Relative to Pollinator Health by Dr. Richard Cowles,** *CTAgricultural Experiment Station, Valley Laboratory.* 

This presentation will provide a framework to understand how this class of insecticides can be used to minimize risk to pollinators, while also providing details for use patterns that should be avoided due to the risk of high levels of residues that could cause harm.
